Mosquito Fogger

Council has often borrowed a fogger from City of Geraldton and more recently Shire of Yalgoo

A fogger could be added to council's plant and be offered as a community service, to be hired or utilised.

Mig Welder

Council currently has a very old arc welder that is past its best days. By equipping the Depot with a Mig, then our mechanic can utilise this unit whilst repairing out equipment. Mig welders range from \$1000 to \$10,000. I will be suggesting a gasless unit to the value of \$1500. This has the ability to weld from panel work to 12mm (1/2").

Sundry Plant Purchases

Sundry Plant purchases cover items such as, pressure washers, small generators, pumps etc. These items are usually between \$2000 and \$5000, so require to be classified as assets. By having an allowance to replace these units allows the CEO to replace these items when they fail.

BACKGROUND

Council own a bowl tipper that we have been trying to sell. The best offer we have had for the unit is \$3500. It's written down value is currently \$13339.

The requirement for a second water cart has become evident in the last few construction contracts. Sometime we require an extra tanker for short periods, and due to mobilisation costs this is sometimes not economical.

To mount 2 x 13000 litres poly tanks on steel frames to our existing trailer base, would cost approximately \$29000, with an allowance of \$5000 for plumbing a dribble bar.

This tanker is not necessarily required to have a pump and motor on it, but could be fitted later if the need arises.

An allowance of \$45000 has been drafted in the 2009-10 budgets.

Multi Tyred Roller

We have been hiring a Multi Tyred roller for the last six months, the best rate that this can hired for is \$300 per day with a minimum 20 day hire per month. We are about to start on a road construction strategy that will require the use of this unit.

A used unit would be ok for this use.

Backhoe

A used backhoe would assist the works crew to be able to complete works in two different locations. The "half a loader" we are short could be used with the 6 wheeler, and do small construction jobs without having to mobilise or stop construction on other sites. This was highlighted recently when fixing the grid south of settlement and we had to move the loader from the northern end of the shire to the grid to be repaired.

Backhoe's are generally the "dog's body" loader and get used for all sorts of jobs. As our crew has increased we will have the ability to complete more works at more sites than we have been able to in the past.
