15.1.2 Works Report

Flood Damage

- Road work from Boolardy Station to CSIRO.
- Road completed and flood damage crew now on Boolardy Kalli Road.
- Ross Ariti from Kalli station will be providing meals and accommodation for flood damage crew at his station from the commencement of the next swing. This will save a considerable amount of travel time therefore increasing time actually spent on road works. Most of the crew are currently staying at the settlement and travel is approx 3 hours per day. This is too long and not utilising our resources productively.
- Paul Squires crew are off flood damage work for a while and are working for CSIRO on Pindar-Beringarra Road to meet their obligations to maintain road conditions.

Mick Wall is doing a run around top of Shire:

- Butchers Track
- Carnarvon Mullewa Road to North Boundary
- Byro to Milly Milly Erong Road

He will then see what he can do with the road north of Innouendy. From there he will proceed to Beringarra out to the bitumen on the Beringarra – Cue road.

Once completed Mick will start on Mileura-Nookawarra road then down to Boolardy, across to Twin Peaks and down to Carnarvon-Mullewa before polocrosse carnival on the 16th and 17th July.

Unfortunately not many crew left with Neil in Royal Perth Hospital with a broken leg (which also takes out Fiona) leaving Stuart, Will and Colleen. (Sandy on semi-retirement).

I have contacted Tommy Cross and he will hopefully begin work on Wednesday 15th June to replace Neil. (this is subject to roads being open as there is more rain due on Tuesday).

Crew will finish the road at intersection of Twin Peaks carting in gravel and spreading out and leaving until commencement of next stage. They will then return to the Settlement to proceed on the 4km just north of settlement.

Proposed Road Works and Employment

I would like to talk about next year's jobs and road works program.

Plant replacement – The Cobra roller has died. Will expand at meeting.

• New John Deere 770 grader has been delivered and 12H traded.

Staff – Ross John Collins has taken on the position of service and maintenance of all plant.

I am going to Geraldton on Saturday 11th June to interview 2 casual employees for work with the Shire. One is to replace Ross off-siding with Stuart to install all grids and signs and the other will join the works crew.

Chris Graham has completed 3 full grids. One is for Carnarvon–Mullewa road at the Pinegrove turnoff . I hope to have the grids in place when CatWest are out doing floodway damage on Carnarvon-Mullewa Road so the grid approaches can be sealed at the same time.(this will include the one at Bullardoo Station)

CatWest are due out on Wednesday 15th June to complete flood-ways and will be camping at Twin Peaks.

99% of shoulder repairs on Carnarvon Mullewa road south of settlement have been completed. There is some sand to be carted away and more gravel to be carted in just south of the settlement (1km). Signs and drainage also to be completed.

Matter for Consideration:

This report recommends that Council endorse the 2010/2011 Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund (CLGF) funding application and authorise the Shire President and Chief Executive Officer to sign the document and affix the Shire's Common Seal.

Background:

In May 2011 the Shire met all of the conditions for acquittal of the 2008/2009 CLGF funds and is now eligible to access the 2010/2011 CLGF funds. A copy of the draft funding agreement for the 2010/2011 CLGF funds was forwarded to Elected Members on 15 June 2011.

Comment:

The 2010/2011 CLGF funding application requests that the funds totalling \$575,452 be made available for the ongoing upgrade and sealing of a further 10 Kms of the Carnarvon-Mullewa road. This is in accord with Council's Five Year Forward Capital Works Plan which was endorsed by Council and the Department of Regional Development and Lands (RDL) in December 2010.

Matter for Consideration:

This report recommends that Council renew a contract for Ranger Services with Peter Smith, for a period of three years commencing 1 July 2011.

Background:

Mr Peter Smith has been contracted by the Shire of Murchison to provide Ranger services since May 2007. The main duty provided has been canine and cat control and the number of service visits to the Shire is as follows:

The contract for Ranger services with the Shire is due to expire on 30 June 2011. Mr Smith has requested that the contract be renewed for a three year period. Usually Mr Smith visits the Shire on request from the Chief Executive Officer or the Works Foreman.

Comment:

Mr Smith has advised that during the period 1/7/2010 to 15/6/2011 he has destroyed 32 dogs and 21 cats within the Shire of Murchison. The majority of these dogs and cats have been associated with the Pia Wadjari Community. However Mr Smith believes that his Ranger duties assist with limiting the number of wild dogs in the region which is reducing stock losses on Stations within the Shire.

Matter for Consideration:

This report recommends that Council provide financial support up to \$400 for the printing of the publication titled Bush Voices.

Background:

Mrs Emma Foulkes-Taylor is producing the current publication of Bush Voices. The magazine is provided free to residents of the Murchison and surrounding regions and is produced with a considerable contribution from Murchison Arts Council members.

The magazine printing costs are usually covered by donations and the Shire has previously donated its photocopier and paper supply. Mrs Foulkes-Taylor is requesting that Council agree to provide use of the photocopier and supply the paper for the current edition of the Bush Voices.

Comment:

The purpose of the Bush Voices is to maintain a sense of community by providing local and regional news, stories and information to the wider region. Approximately 200 copies are mailed free of charge to Stations and about 40 are sent under subscription to people now residing outside the region.

The cost involved for use of the photocopier is generally determined by the number of pages that require copying. It is estimated that there will be around 250 copies with 20 pages in each, which equals an estimated total of 5,000 pages. Most public libraries charge on average .06c per page to cover costs totalling approximately \$300 for the photocopying and around an additional \$100 for incidentals.

Background:

Council has commissioned Mr Bill Mitchell to formulate an agreement with CSIRO to provide Council with funding to be used for the maintenance of the Beringarra-Pindar Road during the construction phase of the development of the Boolardy ASKAR project.

Mr Mitchell, selected CSIRO personnel and staff from Council's legal representative have negotiated a draft Agreement which has been circulated to Elected Members.

Comment:

Following the acceptance of this Agreement, Mr Mitchell, CSIRO representatives and Council's legal representative will proceed to develop a further Agreement which will seek to establish a level of funding that will be used to carry out upgrade work on the Beringarra-Pindar road which will provide for safer travel on the Beringarra-Pindar road for road users from CSIRO, ASKAR, SKA and the general public.
