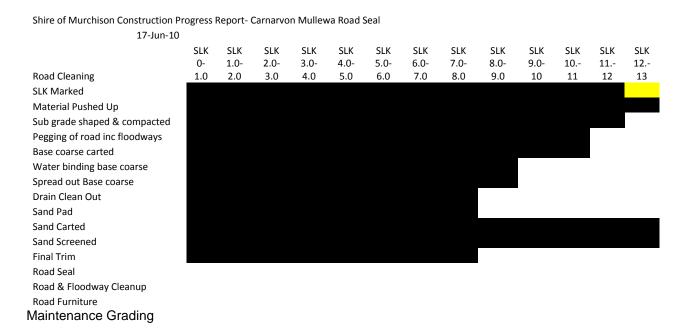

Consideration of sealing options for Carnarvon Mullewa Road

BACKGROUND

The new roadwork's south of the sand seal has 7-10km ready for sealing

At a recent visit by our consulting engineer, an inspection was carried out on the sealing works that was laid down in 2007.

The seal from the settlement to approx 17 km requires some remedial work to extend the life of the seal. It is very thin in places and is described as dead seal. The last three km require a more drastic approach as the pavement under the seal is cracking and will require some remedial work in the next six months to extend its life.

Upon further investigation of a sand seal, this type of seal requires a large amount of traffic volume and continuous cover of sand to "keep alive " the seal. This type of seal is required to continue moving around to maintain an optimum life.

Council has previously endorsed to continue with a sand seal approach to the current project.

The current program is funded by RTR and RRG.

The shire has a couple of different seal types around the shire. The Jiggernoo strip was sealed in 2004 with a single coat seal, the bypass road at the bridge was sealed with a two coat 10/7 seal.

When spraying bitumen there is optimum times and core pavement temperatures that need to be met. An example of this is that the pavement should be around 21 degrees before applying any bitumen. In Murchison's climate now, getting the pavement to 21 degrees would mean the contractors should not start until 10.30am and be finished by 3.00pm, or thereabouts. Getting contracting teams to spray when the right time is, is extremely challenging.

Based on the initial costs of a sand seal, this is always the cheapest option.

Sand seal cost \$2.87 per square meter

10mm seal cost \$ 4.00 per square meter

14mm seal cost \$ 4.83 per square meter

Sand seal also requires constant rework of sand and rolling due to our low volume of traffic.

The cost to seal the 18km we are preparing using different styles is;

Sand Seal 80000 square meters \$ 229,600

10mm Aggregate Seal \$320,000

14mm Aggregate seal \$ 386,400

Both aggregate seal will require a second coat at some stage, in Jiggernoo Strip's case it is likely to occur in 2010, an 8 year period between major works. The current sand seal requires action now, a period of 2 years.

With RTR and RRG funding we could utilise this funding for making the pavement, and utilise the R4R to seal.

We currently have a tender contract with Boral to complete these works. Should a change be made to the specification we would need to arrange this change.

Cr Mitchell has given written notice of his resignation effective as of 21 May 2010.

Council would also be aware of the Minister's intention as part of the structural reform program announced, regarding Councillor Representation. In addition to the push for amalgamations, the Minister's stated intention is that there should be only 6 to 9 elected members.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

Local Government Act 1995 - The following framework applies for changes to representation under the Local Government Act 1995 –

Members of council

Section 2.17(2) - If the method of filling the office of mayor or president is election by the council, the council is to consist of not less than 6 or more than 15 councillors.

Changing the number of councillors

Section 2.18(3) - The Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister may make an order to change the number of councillors as changing the councillors for a ward or a combination of these.

Section 2.18(4) - The Minister can only make a recommendation if the Local Government Advisory Board (LGAB) has made a recommendation under Schedule 2.2.

(Clause 8(b) of Schedule 2.2 applies in this instance).

Local government may propose ward changes or make minor proposals

Schedule 2.2(5) - A local government, whether or not it has received a submission may -

- a) Carry out a review of whether or not an order under section 2.2, 2.3(3) or 2.18(3) should; in the council's opinion be made;
- b) Propose * to the LGAB, the making of an order under Section 2.2(1), 2.3(3) or 2.18(3) if in the opinion of council the proposal is
 - I) One of a minor nature; and
 - ii) Not one about which public submissions need be invited;

Or

iii) Propose * to the Minister the making of an order changing the nature of the district or a ward.

*Absolute majority required

Reviews

Schedule 2.2(7) – Before carrying out a review, a local government has to give local public notice advising –

- a) That the review is to be carried out; and
- b) That submissions can be made on not less than 6 weeks after notice is given (date to be fixed). The local government is to consider the submissions made.

Recommendation by Advisory Board

Schedule 2.2(10)(1) - Where under clause 5(b) a local government proposes to the LGAB the making of an order under section 2.2(1), 2.3(3) or 2.18(3), and the LGAB is of the opinion that the proposal is –

- (a) One of a minor nature: and
- (b) Not one about which public submissions need be invited, the LGAB in a written report to the Minister, is to recommend the making of the order but otherwise is to inform the local government accordingly and the local government is to carry out a review.

COMMENT

Cr Mitchell has advised of his resignation from Council effective 21 May 2010. It is appropriate to consider whether the Shire could be adequately served by six elected members, rather than seven.

This matter requires immediate decision, as there are several options open to Council, each of which has its own timeframes and deadlines –

- 1. retain seven elected members In which case a decision needs to be made as to either -
 - an extraordinary election, within 4 months of effective date of resignation, that is, by 21
 September 2010, or
- 2. reduce to six elected member

Extraordinary election

Under the Local Government Act s.4.9 (1) a date for an extraordinary election is to be set by either the President or Council within one month of notice of resignation being received, unless –

- application is made for the vacancy to remain unfilled until the next local government elections date, subject to conditions and requirements
- the number of elected members is reduced

Vacancy to remain unfilled

s.4.17 (3) stipulates that the vacancy can remain unfilled, only if 80% of positions are occupied. As 80% of 7 councillors are 5.6, it is possible that 80% would be considered to be 6 elected members.

Should Council decide not to seek to reduce the number of elected members from seven to six, there will need to be an extraordinary election held, either as per the LG Act timetable (within 4 months of the vacancy occurring, i.e. by 21 September 2010),

Reduction in Number of Elected Members

Council's base position is that it carried out a review of wards and representation in 2007 which resulted in the current position of a two ward system.

The Shire Consolidated Electoral Roll for the 2007 elections records 106 electors resulting in a ratio of one councillor to approximately 15 electors – amongst the smallest elector to councillor rations in the State.

If the number of elected members is reduced to 6, there will be a ratio of one councillor to approximately 17 electors. This is still amongst the smallest elector/councillor rations in the State; however, the Act does not permit fewer than six councillors.

There are 16 local governments with less than 50 electors per elected members –

There is of course no magic figure as to what is the optimum ratio; however one can observe from the above there are currently a number of other small local governments who function with seven or less councilors.

The Minister and the LGAB is keen to see local governments with smaller councils, this trend has also been apparent where the state government has had a hand in the re-shaping of certain local governments. This occurred with the split up of the City of Perth and the creation of the Towns of Cambridge, Victoria Park and Vincent. Each of these has a population greater than 24,000 and function with a council of nine. Other examples include the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River and York as mentioned above.

Overall, there is nothing to suggest that six members for Murchison would not be unreasonable and would make little difference to operations under the existing regime. Over the past 2 years, there have been several occasions where Council has operated for periods with only six elected members.

In conclusion there are three choices available to Council on the question of structural reform -

- Retain the status quo (i.e., not initiate a review and therefore retain council representation at 7, or
- Initiate a review of representation and follow the procedure set down in the LG Act 1995; or
- propose to the LGAB the making of an order for the reduction of offices of councillor on council from 7 to 6 under section 2.18(3) if in the opinion of council the proposal is
 - I) One of a minor nature; and
 - ii) Not one about which public submissions need be invited.

The last dot point above is the favoured outcome for the following reasons –

- A reduction of one councillor will embrace the concept of structural reform as portrayed by successive State governments, and being pursued by the Minister.
- There is an ideal opportunity now for Council to pursue this avenue due to the existing vacancy which would otherwise be filled by an extraordinary election.
- Council will be able to demonstrate cost savings to its membership section through reduced expenses.
- There is no evidence of hardship or lack of effectiveness by other local governments who have 6 members.
- By proposing the making of an order under section 2.18(3) and the declaration by council the proposal is a minor one, there will be a significant saving in public advertising and administrative procedures.

If the reduction in numbers takes immediate effect, it avoids any complications with the requirement for 80% of seats to remain filled.
