News from the CEO's Desk

Hello Community Members,

It started with a great brunch before a day of fun on the green. The day continued until well into the late afternoon.

My thanks also to Paul & Jo Squires for initiating the day and to the members of the community that were able to attend.

If you would like to have a game of bowls or just try it out the Shire has bowls and mats available for loan.

The Shire is willing to consider hosting similar events and would welcome ideas from the community. Who knows maybe a 10km fun ride and BBQ next? Please contact Bernie Peirl at our office with your ideas.

The Polocrosse weekend was held at the beginning of July. It was fairly well attended and I thank the Shire crew for their work in assisting to keep it running smoothly. Peter and Nicole, from the Roadhouse, arranged for Coral Coast Helicopter Services to offer flights over the settlement. In relation to the SKA Project I would like to invite all members of our community to a meeting with the SKA/CSIRO to be held at the community centre at 11 am on the 22nd August 2018. The objective of the meeting is to discuss the impact of the SKA Project and the Radio Quiet Zone on the community and on the local economy. Some of the areas of concern that have been raised are:

Road issues

Restriction of access to gravel pits and water for public works.

Road agreements and procedures in times of road closures and preventative measures

Compensation to shire for extra burden operations and admin.

Status on Land Tenure

Opportunities for R&D in the district

Progress of fencing around Boolardy's boundaries

Opportunities for local labour and businesses

Interpretive centre

SKA/CSIRO input

Interaction of tourists and the actual site

The impact on rates for the Shire

Delay of road upgrades and maintenance

Notice of tradies, choppers for vermin control, etc coming to do work share resources

Position on stray cattle

Other impact on tourism and pastoral activities

Use of drones for monitoring rangelands condition and soil carbon

Future restrictions on solar pumps and electric fences

RFI - Mobiles, UHF radios, mobiles, wifi and the restricted zones (RALI MS32) – impact on tourism, mustering and local businesses, especially safety

Vermin control - CSIRO input and streamlining processes with pastoralists and CRBA

Compensation for impact on pastoral/tourism activities

Finally, I will be away from the office in August. In my stead Rose Jones will be the acting CEO.

Brief roundup of the past several months from Rossco Foulkes-Taylor - Council President

Hello All,

There has been some pretty reasonable winter rain for the majority of the Shire since the last edition of the Monologue which has certainly

freshened the country up.

Unfortunately an area in the north east of the Murchison that missed out on decent summer rain has also not done that well with winter falls either.

I really feel for those that have not got some winter feed on the ground.

I recently drove to Kalgoorlie and back via Sandstone and from 50 odd km east of Yalgoo onwards the country showed no sign of any winter rain at all.

Council has been working through a number of different issues over the past months.

A few of these include:

- · Working with Main Roads, to finalise the Twin Peaks Murchison River Crossing to MRO road design, for the upgrade required to facilitate the SKA construction and then maintenance traffic. Most aspects are sorted out but it would be fair to say that our council is considerably more conservative than Main Roads on what is an acceptable road height across flood country. We have a meeting planned to try and sort out a design we are all satisfied with.
- The Beringarra to Cue road being returned to gravel is a job that is progressing ok gravel/calcrete and water availability have been surveyed and following some final road design and drainage work we should be ready to call tenders for the work.
- Following the widespread road damage during Ex-Cyclone Joyce in January a significant claim was submitted through the WA Natural Disaster Relief system (more commonly referred to as Flood Damage). This claim was successful and having received a number of tender applications Council hopes to award the road restoration work contracts at the July meeting. The work has been split into three separate contracts North, South East and South West.

Four of the Shire crew have headed off after many years of very good service. I wish Sharon, Brian, Peta and Barry all the best for whatever they plan to do next.






- The Shire provided our Community and all employees the opportunity for Tetanus and Flu Vaccinations




